at Cranmore

The Governors wish to offer the benefit of a Cranmore education through our Assisted Places Scheme to families whose circumstances would prevent them from being able to afford full fees at Cranmore. Cranmore's ethos is central in supporting each child's spiritual and social development; our pupils leave us equipped with the life-benefiting attributes of care and concern for others, tolerance and trust.

WHAT ARE CRANMORE ASSISTED PLACES?

Cranmore Assisted Places Scheme - which was launched in 2009 - has provided educational funding to many families. The majority of our Assisted Places pupils have subsequently been awarded similar financial support at senior schools after leaving Cranmore.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Anyone in our catchment area with gross assessed family annual income of £35,000 or less could be eligible for free education at Cranmore. At a higher level of annual assessed income on a sliding scale up to £70,000, 50 per cent fee relief may be offered. In addition to earned income the value of any assets held - including the net value of any owned family home - will of course also be taken into account.

HOW DO WE APPLY?

If you would like your child to be considered for an Assisted Place, please contact our Bursar to obtain a provisional financial assessment. You will then be advised of the approximate level of fee relief you might expect to receive if awarded a place. If this level of fee relief seems sufficient, you may go ahead and register your child with our standard registration form.



Applicants for Cranmore Assisted Places are assessed in Year 2 or above. Awards are open to all who are not already in independent education. Applicants need to meet our high academic standard, subject to a means-tested financial review of their family circumstances.
